

RECYCLE:

THESE ITEMS IN YOUR BLUE CART

MAKE SURE METAL BAR FACES THE STREET

Paper and Cardboard

Newspaper, junk mail, magazines, catalogs, paperbacks, brown bags, gray paperboard (cereal & tissue boxes), school and office paper.



Plastic Bottles and Food Containers

Including berry boxes and yogurt cups.



Glass Bottles and Jars

Labels are okay!



Metal Cans

EMPTY non-hazardous aerosols like whipped cream cans and air freshener sprays are okay!



Cartons

CART VS.



PUT RECYCLING CURBSIDE BY 6 A.M.

Set carts at least 3 feet from trash cans, mailboxes, basketball systems, cars, etc.

RECYCLING TIPS:

- Flatten boxes
- Remove styrofoam and plastic wrap
- Empty and rinse all containers
- Throw away plastic caps and lids

SHREDDED PAPER RULES:

- Shred only what you must or bring shred to County Shredder Days. If you wish to put shredded paper in your cart,
- Seal it in small cardboard box marked "shred" or
 - Tie in sturdy, **CLEAR** (no tinted), plastic bags.
- This is the **ONLY** time plastic bags can be used for recycling.

NO PLASTIC BAGS!

They get tangled in sorting screens. Recycle at grocery stores.



DO NOT RECYCLE:

NO plastic with  and no cups, caps or lids.

NO batteries

NO plastic wrap or plastic newspaper sleeves.

NO flower pots, flat plastic food trays or pill bottles.

NO aluminum foil or trays or styrofoam.

NO hardback books, frozen food or food-contaminated boxes.

NO bulbs, glassware, dishes or window glass.

NO motor oil, paint, pesticide containers or propane tanks.

NO LOOSE SHREDDED PAPER
It's too small to sort, clogs machines, and ends up as trash.



RECYCLING CARTS ARE MUNICIPAL PROPERTY

It is illegal to put trash in your cart or move it to a new property.
